Kossuth Public Safety Endowment Fund



The Kossuth County Public Safety Endowment Fund established by Donald Tietz will benefit the charitable activities of Kossuth Public Safety including to support enhancements and innovation beyond routine operational expenses and normal capital expenditures. The following organizations are able to apply for grant funding, to be approved by a governing committee.

Kossuth County Sheriff's Department

Kossuth County is the largest county in the state of Iowa with almost 1,000 square miles. The KCSO consists of a sheriff, chief deputy, sergeant, seven patrol deputies, jail administrator, eleven jailers, and three office employees. The sheriff's office provides contract law enforcement to 10 small towns within the county as well as rural areas.

Algona Police Department

The Algona Police Department is a 24/7 law enforcement agency consisting of fourteen full-time and four part-time employees, along with twelve reserve officers. In addition to performing all the regular functions of police work, the department provides many special services. Those include Police Canine, ALICE Training, STEP, DARE, Elementary School Visits, Student Academy, House Checks, Drug Task Force, Animal Control, and Police Reserve Unit.

Algona Ambulance Service

The Algona Ambulance Service is a combination service consisting of five fulltime paramedics and approximately 25 volunteer drivers, EMTs, paramedics, and registered nurses, providing emergency medical care and transportation to the City of Algona and Kossuth County. The Algona Ambulance Service responds to approximately 1,200 calls for service every year.

Kossuth County EMS Association

The Emergency Medical Services of Kossuth County formed this association in 1986 to help provide the people of the county with the best emergency care possible. Kossuth County EMS Association has members on state boards to help with policies which affect the care they can provide patients. Grants received from the state and community organizations help with training and purchasing new equipment.

Algona Fire Department

The Algona Fire Department was established in 1886. Throughout the years, the department's mission remains the same, to promote fire safety and protecting lives and property in the event of a natural or unnatural disaster. The department covers 150 square miles, including the city of Algona and the burgs of Hobarton and Sexton. Algona Fire averages 52 calls per year including rescues, auto accidents and fires.
